Step 1: Download a copy of the Fair Access Policy Roadmap

Ensure you and your LGA understand the Roadmap requirements and timelines.



Tip: Refer to the Fair Access Principles on page 16 if you're not sure where to start! Step 2: Get up to speed on what your organisation might already have in place

Do an audit of any relevant policies your LGA may already have in place – e.g. an active women and girls strategy.



Reminder: Your council must adopt a policy (or equivalent) by 1 July 2024 to remain eligible for Victorian Government community sports infrastructure funding



Step 3: Undertake a gender impact assessment (GIA)

A GIA will help you apply a gender lens to review or develop your gender equitable access and use policy.

GIAs are a requirement under the Gender Equality Act 2020.

Step 4: Use GIA findings to inform the development of a gender equitable access and use policy (or update an existing policy)

Your policy should be locally relevant and representative of your LGA's specific needs.
