The policy does not ask you to take away time from the men or boys, it just asks that consideration is given to women and girls when scheduling games or training sessions. Remember, you are one club – so the success of all teams is what you're striving for and you need to fairly equip everyone for this!

Men have a vital role to play in building a world that is gender equal – and there are many men who are already working towards this.
